The unparallel ramifications of the AIDS epidemic are increasing, requiring a stronger commitment from Reencontro.

The following figures put Mozambique as one of Africa's most AIDS affected countries:

- 12.2% of 15-49 year olds are estimated to be living with HIV/AIDS
- 75% of children under 15 living with HIV/AIDS require ARV treatment.
 By mid-2006, of an estimated 74,000 infected eligible children, only 2,300 were receiving treatment representing less then 3%
- Of the country's estimated 1.6 million orphans, more than 380,000 have lost parents due to HIV/AIDS. (more then 20% of total orphaned children).
- It is projected that by 2010 the country will be home to 926,000 AIDS orphans.

Reencontro provides access to basic services and social assistance through-community based home care for children orphaned by AIDS.

After identifying orphans, community support groups provide adequate assistance and care through the following initiatives:

- * Education and Health Services
- Preventive Education
- Professional Skills & Income Generation Empowerment
- Food and Nutrition
- Legal Advocacy & Citizenship Registration of Children

For orphans often left without anything but the clothes on their back, Reecontro offers a beacon of hope through the darkness of unspeakable tragedy.
